Roger Abramson is a pioneer in the Civil Rights Movement. He marched with Civil Rights activist Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and work with dynamic politicians such as Robert Kennedy, Julian Bond and Andrew Young. Mr. Abramson, raised in Ohio in an upper-middle class household, began his Civil Rights work in high school when he created a music trio with two of his black classmates. It was this experience that gave him a first-hand glimpse at racism and hatred.

Mr. Abramson continued his crusade for equal rights when he joined a movement in Cincinnati to fight against racist policies at a local swimming pool. He later became the chairman of the Southern Ohio chapter of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). As chair of SNCC, he was charged with leading voter registration drives, sit-ins and freedom rides. He also organized concerts to promote cultural awareness.

An advocate for equality in education, Mr. Abramson led a boycott of Cincinnati public schools citing the disparities in black and white schools. Mr. Abramson was most recently feted for his immense contributions to the Civil Rights movement by being inducted into the Ohio Civil Rights Hall of Fame.

Mr. Abramson has appeared in classrooms to share personal stories about rock music legends such as Jimi Hendrix and Janis Joplin. As a member of the Miami Beach Cultural Arts Council he was appointed to represent the council on matters regarding schools in Miami Beach. His grandchildren have attended South Pointe Elementary, Nautilus Middle , Miami Beach Senior High, Design and Architecture Senior High, and presently one is attending North Beach Elementary.
