The Bottom Line for State and National Assessments

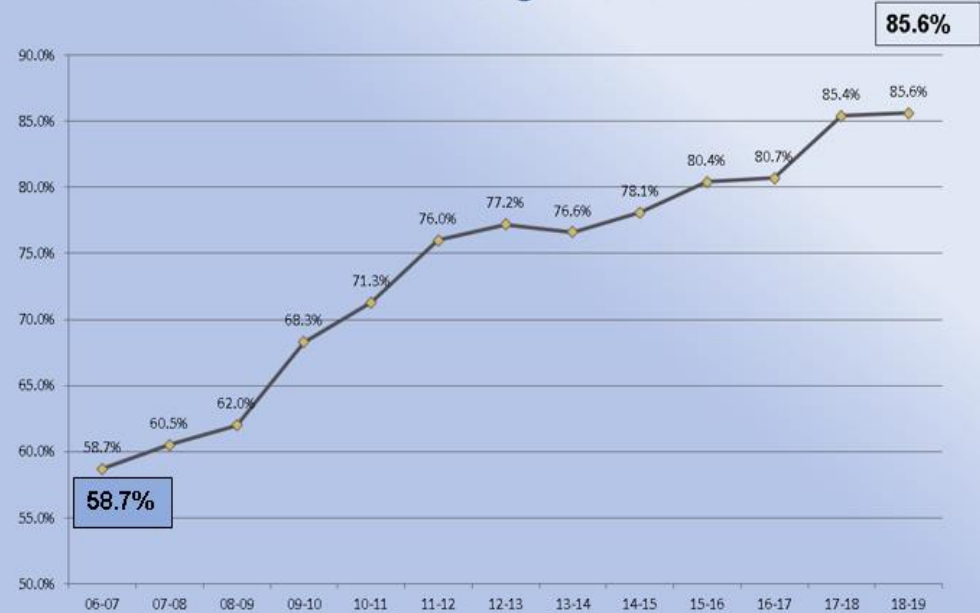
Fourth graders' National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) scale scores ranked #1 in both Reading and Math among all in the Trial Urban District Assessment program. NAEP scores were significantly higher than public schools nationwide in Grade 4 Reading and Math. In Florida's Spring 2019 statewide assessments in English Language Arts, students in Grade 3-8 outscored their counterparts statewide. In Math, higher percentages of students in Grades 3-6 scored in Levels 3 and above than their counterparts statewide. For the first time, our students outscored students statewide on four of five End-of-Course assessments.

Dr. Martin S. Karp's Policy Initiatives

- Increased emphasis on science research and participation in region science fair, which resulted in a 403% increase in the number of student participants and a 511% increase in the number of high schools represented
- Creation of the STEAM Scholarship Awards Banquet
- Reviewing homework guidelines for allowable screen time recommendations for the purpose of ensuring the balanced use of textbooks and technology
- Combating on campus use of e-cigarette vaping devices by providing training for school staff, collaborating with and educating parents, and seeking grants
- Addressing COVID-related issues early including protocols for traveling and newly registered students arriving from locations outside Miami-Dade County
- Implementation of consistent sexual abuse prevention programs and training including on-line components
- Addressing stereotyping, scapegoating, antisemitism, and all forms of hatred
- Improvement and expansion of services for students with ADHD with a focus on classroom management techniques and parent education programs
- Formulation of a pilot program for later start times in high schools
- Formulation of a pilot program for stand-up desks
- Installation of fruit and vegetable snack vending machines in the district
- Improved job training/employment opportunities for students with disabilities
- Development of the REGAL Plan that led to an increase in gifted certified teachers, and greater access to a differentiated curriculum
- Reviewed curriculum and training needs for the purposes of educating gifted children with dual exceptionalities
- Expanding the Driver Education behind-the-wheel training with the addition of new vehicles, curriculum, and professional development for instructors
- Offering services to students with autism by extending programing beyond the current age of 22
- Increased services for students in foster care and implemented foster care and adoption friendly workplace initiatives
- Provided support for substitute teachers, and established reporting procedures
- Funded 3 school site programs/demonstration rooms for students with ADHD
- Funded after-school Lego robotics programs
- Funded after school Extended Foreign Language programs
- Helped to create our partnership with City Year
- Explored additional opportunities to reduce Federal and State mandated tests
- Implementation of improved address verification rules and strategies to address overcrowding

Taxes: Millage Rate ↓

Good News for Taxpayers

The School District's millage for 2020-21 is among the lowest since 1979, and a decrease from 2019-20. The total millage rate this year is 7.1 mills, which is down from 8.7 mills in my first term in office, an unprecedented and historic drop.

The total millage includes 0.75 mills approved by the voters in November 2018 that is used strictly for teacher salaries and law enforcement officers in our schools. Even though the voters approved a 0.75 mills increase, the millage since that date has only increase by 0.396 mills, 47% lower than expected.
